In reference to Agenda Item No. 6, Memberships and Sponsorships, LCMC Vice Chair Greg Pettis asked staff to ensure that SCAG's membership support will not be used for the organization's election/campaign activities. Darin Chidsey, Chief Operating Officer, responded that SCAG is cautious with maintaining memberships for these types of organizations who likewise understand the need to separate membership funds from public agencies and be used specifically for membership purposes and information sharing-related activities and not be used for political campaign activities.

TC Chair Viegas-Walker requested for an update regarding the evaluation of SCAG's continuing membership with the National Association of Regional Councils (NARC). Art Yoon, Director of Policy and Public Affairs, responded that SCAG's continuing membership with NARC is valuable as they are the leading advocate for metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) and serve as SCAG's voice in Washington, DC. President Wapner commented that SCAG takes on a leadership role any time it is a member of such national organizations. Darin Chidsey, Chief Operating Officer, stated if there is an interest in serving NARC as an at-large capacity, the next election will be held in June 2019. President Wapner announced to let him know should a member wish to serve in that capacity.

Councilmember Frank Navarro asked for information be shared regarding the benefits of SCAG's continuing membership with NARC and its impact to the agency throughout the years. Art Yoon, Director of Policy and Public Affairs, acknowledged the request.

EEC Chair Linda Parks commented regarding Agenda Item No. 8, SCAG's opposition to SB 828 (Wiener), and noted the need to protect farmlands in Ventura County when developing the next Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA). She emphasized that legislative bills may not always recognize the differences within jurisdictions, and noted how the matter of agricultural lands is a sensitive one especially in the unincorporated areas in Ventura County. President Wapner acknowledged and expressed appreciation for the comment by EEC Chair Parks and stated that although there were amendments made to SB 828, the agency continues to maintain its oppose position on the bill.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President's Memo

In reference to the President's Memo, containing appointments to various committees that had been distributed to the members, President Wapner announced the removal of the appointment of Councilmember Laura Rosenthal, City of Malibu, to the Legislative/Communications and Memberships Committee (LCMC) who will be termed-out in the next few months.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Darin Chidsey, Chief Operating Officer, provided a report on behalf of Hasan Ikhrata, Executive Director, who is currently on vacation. He expressed appreciation for the committee's participation at today's Special Meeting and announced that another Special Meeting of the EAC will be convened in August due to a time-sensitive item that cannot wait until the next regularly scheduled meeting in September. He also announced new legislation [AB 179, Cervantes] requires the California Air Resources Board (ARB) and the California Transportation Commissions (CTCs) to convene at least two (2) joint meetings per calendar year to coordinate implementation of transportation policies. Mr. Chidsey informed the committee that he attended the recently-

held joint meeting of ARB and the CTCs and announced a future meeting in December is currently being scheduled.

Background & Scope of Work:

In preparation of the 2020 Regional Transportation Plan and Sustainable Communities Strategy (RTP/SCS), SCAG will develop scenarios to evaluate impacts of alternative investments and policies and identify potential strategies to incorporate into the RTP/SCS. While SCAG has conducted scenario exercises for past plans, a more comprehensive and participatory process is now needed to confront the increased challenges for the next RTP/SCS including, but not limited to: transformative and disruptive technologies, increased greenhouse gas (GHG) reduction targets per California Senate Bill (SB) 375, new Federal Highway Administration planning requirements, and a concurrent Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) cycle.

The consultant will support SCAG staff in developing a robust envisioning process for scenario development by crafting an outreach strategy and by coordinating outreach activities with multiple stakeholder groups. RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Acting on behalf of the Regional Council in accordance with Article V, Section C, (3)(a) of the SCAG Bylaws, approve contract 18-026-C01 in the amount of \$720,821 to develop a complete, environmentally compliant, and legally-defensible Program Environmental Impact Report (PEIR) for the 2020-2045 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) / Sustainable Communities Strategy (SCS).

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The 2020 RTP is a long-term plan for the development and preservation of the region's transportation system. For a transportation project to become eligible for federal and state funding, it must be included in the financially-constrained portion of the RTP. In addition, per state law,, the 2020 RTP must include a Sustainable Communities Strategy (SCS) that demonstrates compliance with California Air Resources Board greenhouse gas (GHG) emission reduction targets from cars and light duty trucks.

The PEIR or the 2020 RTP/SCS is required by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) to describe any environmental impacts from the plan. Without a certified environmental impact report, the 2020 RTP/SCS and transportation strategies in the 2020 RTP/SCS cannot move forward. The consultant shall write the PEIR and provide services to ensure that environmental compliance procedures under CEQA, Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP 21) Performance Requirements as well as other federal and state environmental laws are adequately addressed and fulfilled in the 2020 PEIR.

STRATEGIC PLAN:

The Southern California Association of Governments is responsible for developing a 2020 Program Environmental Impact Report (PEIR) for the 2020-2045 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) / Sustainable Communities Strategy (SCS) (2020 RTP/SCS). Basis for Selection:

The PRC recommended Impact Sciences, Inc., for the contract award because the consultant's team:

Specifically, the consultant team presented ways to address CEQA sensitivities due to recent developments on CEQA legislation, including SB 375, AB 32, SB 32 and SB 743, and case laws. The team also demonstrated the clearest understanding of the importance of developing a workable framework for the PEIR to optimize both SB 375, SB 743, and other CEQA streamlining opportunities;
- Demonstrated the clearest approach to provide updated noise contour map with respect to aviation activities throughout the region;
- Demonstrated the most extensive, successful experience in creating legally defensible and program-level environmental reviews, and proposed in the interview the best plan to work with SCAG staff to prepare a legally defensible document for this project as well allocating work efforts between the prime and sub-consultants with clearly defined roles; and

The PRC noted that the other firm did not specifically address how they would assist SCAG in analyzing GHG impacts, transportation impacts as well as other topics related to tiering/CEQA streamlining and tribal resources outreach.

Request for Proposal (RFP):

SCAG staff initially notified 3,072 firms of the release of RFP 18-034 via SCAG's Solicitation Management System. A total of 40 firms downloaded the RFP. SCAG received two (2) proposals in response to the solicitation. One from Main Hire Staffing & Outsourcing, and it was non responsive because it was a marketing brochure and did not respond to the scope of work; and the other from Latino Health Access, a non-profit organization. Staff subsequently re-released the RFP (as 18-034A) notifying 4,096 firms via SCAG's Solicitation Management System. A total of 35 firms downloaded the RFP. Latino Health Access submitted the only proposal in response to the second solicitation.

Staff surveyed the 35 firms that downloaded the RFP the second time to determine why each did not submit a proposal. Ten (10) firms responded to staff's inquiry, which disclosed the main reason the firms did not respond was lacked the staff or ability to perform the scope of work. Note staff advertised the RFP twice, for four (4) weeks each time as required by SCAG's Procurement Manual (Section 6.6.3)

Selection Process:

The Proposal Review Committee (PRC) evaluated the proposal in accordance with the criteria set forth in the RFP, and conducted the selection process in a manner consistent with all applicable federal and state contracting regulations. The PRC reviewed the consultant's proposal and found it to be of high quality and reasonable cost. The PRC did not conduct interviews because the proposals contained sufficient information on which to base a contract award.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Staff seeks to amend the contract of the Reddock Law Group to increase its contract value in order to make the final payment for legal services rendered related to a confidential matter. SCAG's policy provides that the Chief Counsel may enter into contracts for legal services on behalf of the agency provided the services are under \$25,000, with said services requiring Regional Council approval should they exceed \$25,000.

The subject contract was initially authorized by the Chief Counsel for \$25,000, and an increase of \$10,000 was approved by the Regional Council on June 7, 2018. The investigation has since been completed and a final invoice was submitted to SCAG above the contract total of \$35,000, thus requiring the approval of additional funds to pay for the final invoice. Staff therefore seeks approval by the EAC, acting on behalf of the Regional Council, to increase the contract value by an additional \$29,625.

STRATEGIC PLAN:

This item supports SCAG's Strategic Plan, Goal 7, secure ample funding to support agency priorities and use best practices to effectively and efficiently deliver work products.

BACKGROUND:

SCAG retained the legal services of the Reddock Law Group in January 2018 for services related to a confidential matter. After completion of its thorough and comprehensive investigation in mid-June 2018, the final services rendered by the firm exceeded the previously approved contract total of \$35,000. For this reason, staff is requesting that the EAC, acting on behalf of the Regional Council, approve an increase of the legal services contract with the Reddock Law Group by \$29,625 in order to make payment on the final invoice.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Funding to increase the contract amount for the Reddock Law Group will be allocated from the Legal Department's General Fund t budget for FY 2017-18.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Supported by the United Nations Industrial Development Organization, the Sixth Annual Shenzhen International Low Carbon City Forum invited SCAG to speak at the event regarding transportation, air quality and other matters. As part of the invitation, the conference organizers have agreed to cover the cost of conference registration; meals; local/ground transportation; five (5) nights of hotel accommodation in Shenzhen and Beijing; and round-trip economy airfare for two (2) SCAG Officers. SCAG will cover travel-related costs for two (2) SCAG staff and the remaining two (2) nights in China for the SCAG Officers. Per SCAG Travel Policy, foreign travel requires Regional Council approval.

BACKGROUND:

STRATEGIC PLAN:

This item supports SCAG's Strategic Plan Goal 7, Objective B: Maximize Efficiency and Effectiveness in Resource Allocation to Maintain Adequate Working Capital, Appropriate Reserves, and Investments, and Utilize Resources in a Timely and Responsible Fashion.

AUDITS

SCAG staff are working with Caltrans to wrap up the incurred cost and Indirect Cost Allocation Plan audit.

SCAG's outside independent auditors, Vavrinek, Trine, Day and Co., performed their interim audit work in April and will return in September to perform their fieldwork.

MEMBERSHIP DUES:

As of July 27, 2018, 94 cities and 2 counties had paid their FY19 dues. This represents about 35.6% of the assessment and is line with prior years. 95 cities and 4 counties have yet to pay. Two cities are being recruited for membership.

BUDGET & GRANTS (B&G):

On June 22, 2018, SCAG was awarded a Senate Bill 1 Sustainable Communities Formula Grant of \$5,170,390 for transportation planning projects. The grant funds have been programmed in the FY 2018-19 (FY18) Overall Work Program (OWP).

On June 26, 2018, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) approved SCAG's FY18 OWP for FTA Section 5303, 5304 and FHWA metropolitan planning funding. The OWP Agreement between SCAG and Caltrans was approved on July 11, 2018.

On July 9, 2018, the Executive Administration Committee (EAC), acting on behalf of the Regional Council (RC), approved an administrative amendment to the FY18 OWP which increased the budget by \$50,000.



On July 31, 2018, staff submitted the FY18 OWP 4th Quarter Progress Report with preliminary expenditures to Caltrans. The 4th Quarter Progress Report with final expenditures will be delivered to Caltrans by August 30, 2018. Additionally, staff is in the process of collecting the FY18 OWP Products and will be submitting them to Caltrans by August 30, 2018.

In July 2018, the Contracts Department issued five (5) Request for Proposals (RFP's); awarded thirteen (13) contracts; issued one (1) contract amendment; and processed 152 Purchase Orders to support ongoing business and enterprise operations. Staff also administered 88 consultant contracts. Contracts staff continued to negotiate better pricing and reduced costs for services. During July 2018 over \$175,108 in budget savings was realized. It should also be noted that during FY18 staff realized \$402,393 in budget savings.



Interest Earnings Variance




OVERVIEW

The amount projected for FY18 is \$122,573, which is \$27,573 more than the target.






OVERVIEW

This was because the IC budget was overspent by \$1.2 million (due mainly to the expensed portions of the furniture and AV equipment for 900 Wilshire) and also because of agency labor & related fringe benefit budget under-runs that caused \$1.8 million of IC under-recovery.







Summary

The chart shows that the Contracts Department is managing Eighty-eight contracts. Thirty-seven are Cost Plus Fixed Fee contracts, 14 are fixed price contracts, and the remaining 37 are Time and Materials (T&M) contracts (includes Labor Hour and Retainer contracts). The Contracts Department anticipates issuing approximately 50 contracts for FY 2018-19. Note, due to the nature of SCAG's work, the majority of SCAG contracts have a one year term and end on June 30th each year.
